Directions

From I-95 South

Take Exit 74C (Broad Street East). At first stoplight make left on Broad Street. Make right at 20th Street and go 4 blocks. Cross Cary St. and make a left into the parking lot.

From I-95 North

Take Exit 74B (Franklin Street). Stay in left lane. Go straight through 1st light and take a left at the 2nd light, Main Street. Go five blocks to 20th street. Turn right, one block, cross Cary Street and park in the parking lot on the left side.

From I-64 West

Take I-64 East which merges with I-95 South and follow the same directions as from I-95 North.

From I-64 East

Take I-64 West to Richmond. Follow the I-95 South Exit and follow the same directions as from I-95 North.

Downtown Expressway

East on 195 (Downtown Expressway). Keep straight through toll and take the 3rd exit, 7th & 9th Street. When exiting stay in far right lane. Keep straight; turn left on 9th Street, stay in right lane and turn right onto

Cary Street. Stay on Cary. The museum is located at 20th Street and Cary. Parking lot is on the right side.

Parking is free in the museum lot.
